The family of four was selected to participate in the homeownership program in late 2021. As part of the partnership agreement, Juan and Ireydiza promised to engage in "sweat equity," which obligated the couple to volunteer 500 hours of their time toward the construction of their home and other projects. Juan exceeded the hours and became a regular fixture at GSHFH build sites.

Do you enjoy getting a new phone or is it more out of necessity? A new phone is purely out of necessity. I have to learn a new variation of something I will never master.


